## WHAT ARE CAPITAL CREDITS?

Because we are a member-owned entity, SWRE strives to operate all segments of operation at cost. As a result, any margins (profits) are returned to you the customer. Your share of these margins is called Capital Credits. At the end of the year, net margins are allocated to each customer in proportion to the customer's cooperative purchases during the year. The Board of Trustees usually decides when to retire Capital Credits based on the cooperative's financial condition at the end of the year. In the meantime, SWRE utilizes the money as working capital for operating and reinvesting in the cooperative until a determination is made.

# ORU DONATES \$40,000 BACK TO TEXHOMA COMMUNITIES

Operation Round Up recently awarded \$40,000 in grants to 21 organizations in southwest Oklahoma and north Texas. This completes the second grant cycle for Operation Round Up, with a grand total of \$65,000 donated back to SWRE communities in the foundation's first year.

This donation was made possible by SWRE members who are enrolled in the Operation Round Up program or participate in Operation Round Up PLUS. Enrolled members choose to have their electric bills rounded up to the nearest dollar amount (this is about 50 cents per month on average). The change is accumulated and distributed in lump sums to charitable causes by the Operation Round Up Board of Directors. Applications are evaluated on a number of factors and should fit within Operation Round Up's five categories of assistance: Communities, Education & Youth, Senior Citizens, Emergency Assistance and Individuals in Need.
