Zac is the son of Tony & Gail Chitwood.

During their trip to Washington, D.C., the two Texoma youth will visit the U.S. Capitol, Mount Vernon, the capital city's many memorials and museums, and Arlington National Cemetery. They will also have the opportunity to visit with numerous elected officials.

Runners-up in the contest are Chris Lopez, Frederick High School, and Lindsey Sawin, Northside High School. Chris is the son of Arcadio

and Frances Lopez, Frederick. Lindsey is the daughter of Lynn and Brice Sawin, Vernon.

As runners-up, Chris and Lindsey will have the opportunity to represent SWRE at the 2020 high school Touchstone Leadership Summit to be held next spring in Oklahoma City.

Students were required to research and write a 500-750-word essay on the topic of "Power for the Future." Nine contest finalists were chosen based on their essays. Eight finalists presented their essays as extemporaneous speeches at a dinner held Thursday evening, February 7, at SWRE headquarters in Tipton. A panel of judges determined contest winners based on the presentations.

The annual SWRE Youth Tour Essay Contest for high school juniors is an annual tradition that began in 1964.

Contest essays were received this year from students in thirteen Texoma schools.

OKLAHOMA CITY – Thirty students, representing Oklahoma’s Electric Cooperatives, attended the 2019 Oklahoma’s Electric Cooperatives Leadership Summit on March 18, 2019, at the Oklahoma State Fair Grounds. Among these students were Southwest Rural Electric Association’s (SWRE) representatives, Jamie Jannaman, a senior at Frederick High School and Kaitlyn Thomas, senior at Northside High School.

Jannaman and Thomas were selected as the 2019 SWRE Youth Summit delegate due to their outstanding scores in the finalist portion of 2018 Youth Tour contest. The students’ essays and speeches won them a \$250 prize from SWRE and a participant spot in the 2019 Youth Leadership Summit program, Thomas and Jannaman also received an additional \$500 scholarship each at the event.

This annual event is designed to excite and motivate high school students to become leaders of their communities. Almost 500 Oklahoma high school students have been recognized for their leadership abilities by having the opportunity to attend one of the previous leadership summits.

The program featured Oklahoma natives, Rhett Laubach and Kelly Barnes, who collectively spent over 40 years sharing leadership messages with students and adults in the education, agriculture, insurance, health, transportation and sales industries. The students learned how to focus on how to make the most of the service and growth opportunities today and in the future. The program helped increase the students understanding of how leaders create change, overcome obstacles and serve others through behavior and attitude.

Grannie's Candied Sweet Potatoes



Ingredients:

5-6 good-sized sweet potatoes
1 stick real butter (with salt)
1/2 C warm water
3 C sugar
1 t vanilla

Directions:

1. Peel and wash sweet potatoes; slice about 1/4" thick.
2. Melt butter over medium heat in a large saucepan or Dutch oven. Add warm water.
3. Add sliced sweet potatoes to the pan. Gently stir in all the sugar.
4. Reduce heat to LOW and cover with a lid.
5. Cook until the potatoes are almost falling apart (about an hour).
6. Stir in vanilla, remove from heat.
